
Dear Fellow Historians,

Their solution was to hike out of sight of the more conservative older residents, then remove their long skirts to reveal their bloomers underneath. They left their skirts hanging on tree branches and climbed the mountains around us in comfort in their bloomers. They picked up their skirts on the way back and arrived home respectably dressed.
